I invite you to read the second number of the *Journal of Hearing Science* for 2020. This issue is packed with three review papers. The first covers ototoxicity as a side-effect of drugs, the second assesses central auditory processing disorder in children and adolescents who have been treated with methylphenidate because of attention deficit disorder, and the third looks at noise-induced hearing loss in children and adolescents. I'm sure you will find something of interest among that wide range of subjects.

The issue follows with research papers on results of a pilot hearing screening in schoolchildren from Armenia, Russia, Kyrgyzstan, and Azerbaijan, expectations of people on a waiting list for a hearing assistance dog, reliability of various psychoacoustic measures using the maximum likelihood procedure, and neural encoding of consonant–vowel transition in children with central auditory processing disorder. The issue concludes with an interesting case study of a rare case of congenital suprasternal dermoid cyst.
